# Life Space Day

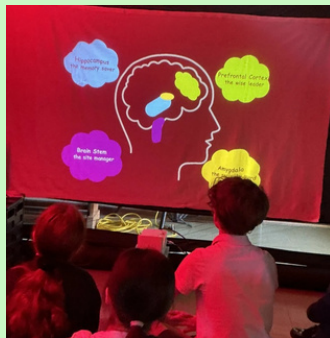
